- You have written paragraphs very quickly.
- Every paragraph could always be better.
- After you write, read what you wrote and think about how it could be better.
- Write it again with those changes.

Revising and editing

- Minor revisions: Sometimes you just need to fix small mistakes or add more information.
- Major revisions: Sometimes you need to go back to the thinking and organizing to make the paragraph clearer or more complete.
- After you revise, read it again.
- Grammar is the *least* important thing, but do fix mistakes if you find them.

Revising: Major revisions

You can prepare a delicious apple pie if you follow these four steps. First, make the crust. Combine 150 grams of flour with 100 grams of butter and 30cc water. Roll the dough into a thin sheet and put it in a pie pan. Next, peel five or six apples and slice them into thin pieces. After the apples are sliced, mix them in a large bowl with 150 grams of sugar and 10 grams of cinnamon. Gently spoon the apple mixture into the crust. The last step it to bake the pie in the oven at 170° for 40 minutes. When the crust is brown and the apples are soft, remove the pie from the oven and let it cool for 15 minutes.

- Your goal is to communicate your ideas. Does this paper succeed at that goal?
- Try to imagine someone reading the paper. Is there anything she or he might find unclear, distracting, or not completely explained?
 - This is the hardest part of revising: trying to imagine what someone else will think about your ideas.
