- Make a design to implement education projects and programmes.
- Set goals of national educational development for the next 5 years.
- Measure and improve the impacts of education activities.
- Analyze and manage a major bottleneck of the educational situation in a country.

What is the Education Policy?

- An explicit or implicit decision or group of decisions which may set out directives for guiding future decisions, initiate or retard action, or guide implementation of previous decisions (IIEP, Education policy-planning process: an applied framework)
- Specification of priorities and procedures for distributing goods and services to the members of society (Sutton and Levinson, Policy as Practice: Toward a Comparative Sociocultural Analysis of Educational Policy)
- Six dimensions of the change process: Context + Process + Policy & Planning + Implementation + Evaluation + Institutionalization & Organizational Learning (Cummings and Williams, Policy-Making for Education Reform in Developing Countries)



Scope of the Education Policy

Strategic (National Education Strategic Plan, National Strategy for TVET)

 Programme

 (Teacher Training Policy, Curriculum Development Policy)

Issue-specific (Syrian refugee assistance policy) High Complexity, Broad Criteria, Imprecise Decision Environment

Low Complexity, Narrow Criteria, Precise Decision Environment



Scope of the Education Policy

• Sector wide

(All significant funding for the sector supports a single sector policy and expenditure programme)

• Sub-sector wide

(e.g. focusing only on basic
education as a sub-sector and adopting
flexible funding modalities
→ expanded primary education provision
needs to respond to the demand for
lower secondary)

• Single Issue / Dimension (e.g. focusing specifically on the access to education, etc.)
